

Mother Nature fooling around with the atmosphere is that if you haven't tucked your Healey away for the 'winter' season you could get it out and drive it for a day or two at a time. In the event you see someone driving a Healey that you don't recognize, if the opportunity presents itself, give them some literature from the club so they can join in the fun.

We are in the middle of the renewal cycle for the AHCA and for the Bluegrass Austin Healey Club. A large number of you have already renewed for both clubs, but in the event you haven't renewed yet please do so very soon. If you will be at our January meeting you can hand me your renewal there. Dues for both clubs is \$55.00. In case you are wondering where your January issue of the Marque is don't worry any longer. It isn't lost in the mail nor is the mailman reading it (at least I don't think he is). The Marque is being mailed this week.

If any of you are in Phoenix, AZ for the Barrett Jackson auction let us know what you purchase when you return. Even if you came back with nothing but memories let us know what you experienced there.

This past November the Bluegrass AHC hosted the annual fall delegates meeting for the AHCA. As you read in the year in review newsletter Jim Werner published right after the first of the year we had excellent participation from our local club members. Some of our members attended the delegates meeting for both days. Much thanks to Bonnie Chreste, Sonny and Linda Moore, Ben Moore, Jim Werner and Arlene Schneider for helping with the transportation for Saturday nights meal.

Most of the topics during the delegates meeting were in line with the usual list of topics. Dues, insurance, Concours, advertising, regalia, Healey Marque, future conclaves, club finances, club promotion and support and so it goes. One topic that was unique to this meeting was the presentation by Ron Varley, delegate from the St. Louis club. Ron had a proposal that had as its main thrust an effort to reduce the expense of the fall delegates meeting. His efforts and thoughtfulness were laudable. Once the full proposal was presented many of the delegates took the opportunity to participate in the discussion. How Ron's proposal would reduce the expense involved the election of a super-delegate for a region of the country. That super-delegate would represent a number of the current regional clubs. Ron had the number of super delegates set at nine. Ron's effort was to reduce the number of people that attend the fall delegates meeting. In the final analysis the cost saving was not as substantial as might be assumed. The national officers (elected and appointed) still had to travel to the meeting as well as the super-delegates along with specific chaired positions. In addition to the small savings it would have also reduced the involvement of the local clubs at the national level. All of the delegates feel that the opportunity to interact with the national officers and participate in conducting the business of the AHCA was much more important than the small savings would have produced. The vote was close to unanimous for Ron's proposal to not be accepted. Ron was given a very heartfelt thank you from the delegates and officers for his effort.

Another topic that was out of the mainstream is the membership directory. The expense for the directory is considerable and there was much discussion as to how to reduce the costs. The total cost to produce the membership directory for 2011 was slightly over \$14,000. The postage costs amounted to about \$6500. There were also some one-time-only costs that amounted to about \$600 for this issue. The rest of the cost is related to the printing and layout of the directory. (Beth Lunney does the layout for about one tenth of what it would cost if we had to go to the public marketplace for the service) The delegates discussed using lighter weight paper, reducing the amount of information in the book and eliminating the use of an envelope and instead printing the address on the back of the booklet. No decision was made during this meeting as more information needs to be gathered. A committee was appointed to review and report to the officers. This will be a hot topic at the leadership meeting this coming March.

All of the other topics were discussed and reported to the delegates. There aren't any big changes in any of the current topics. Insurance went up just a few dollars for example. Finances for the club are strong and no dues increase was discussed. Bob Gilleland did give notice that he needs to retire from advertising management for the Marque. Bob's work has been very instrumental in keeping our costs down as he consistently does an excellent job of selling advertising for the Marque. Another cost saving for the Marque came from Reid Trummel. Reid continues to find ways to reduce the cost of printing the Marque. The new web site for the AHCA is still under construction. It should be available sometime later this year.

Hope to see you at the upcoming meeting. Make a note of the location. We are on the move again, I think. Don't forget to keep the rubber side down and the top side shiny.


